Herein find a list of the most important terms you will find on sake labels. There are two sets here; they are the same except that the second set has more cursive characters, to help ease you into reading calligraphic characters as well as standard fonts.

Note, the 2nd last term, Futsuu-shu, is not commonly listed on labels, but has been thrown in for good measure. The very last term is there because it will enable you to tell if a sake is a junmai or not from the mandatory ingredients list, should it not be discernible elsewhere. Finally, you have been left with a blank flashcard for your own sake kanji practice.
